



2017 STORMWATER POLLUTION PREVENTION TIPS

Household Hazardous Waste Disposal



- ◆ Some unused household cleaners, fuels, paints, pesticides and other items contain chemicals that can be harmful if improperly managed.
- ◆ Keep products in original & labeled containers. Store and transport chemicals upright, not on their side.
- ◆ DO NOT MIX PRODUCTS TOGETHER. This can cause dangerous and sometimes deadly reactions.
- ◆ Disposing of paint—remove the lid and let the paint dry. Once the paint is dry, you may dispose of it with your regular trash.
- ◆ Used motor oil and oil filters cannot go to landfills. You can check with local automobile repair shops to see if they will take small amounts of oil or oil filters for disposal.
- ◆ Fluorescent lamps & bulbs (CFLs) - there are mail in programs and retailers that will accept these for recycling.
