




PARKS AND RECREATION BOARD TREE ADVISORY BOARD

Angie Wilson, Chair Alonzo Williams, Vice Chair Brittany Harris Heidi Heckel Natalie Austin Tina Capito The Parks and Recreation Advisory Board was assembled in 1995. The Board is composed of six members and two alternates, which are appointed by the City Council. The Board is governed by the Code of Ordinance § 33.35.

The Harker Heights Parks and Recreation Advisory Board shall meet on the second Monday evening of all odd number months, shall have no supervisory function, and shall have no rulemaking or quasi-judicial authority. The Board is organized to advise the City Council on policy and programs.



IMPROVING OUR PARKS AND FACILITIES



Carl Levin Park Playground Renovation

The playground at Carl Levin Park, original to when the park was constructed in 1999, was replaced with a Landscape Structures playscape by Whirlix Design. The design of the playscape incorporates natural play features and prominently features the Monarch Butterfly in the design. It also has a swing and other play features that are more accessible for children with various needs.

Shade Canopy at Purser Family Park Playground

Constructed in 2008, the Purser Family Park Playground area had little shade from the blistering Texas sun. A 50'x30' shade canopy was installed to ensure safety and comfortability of use all year long.



Seating Area at City Hall/Recreation Center & Mayor's Monarch Garden

In 2021, Mayor Spencer H. Smith took the Mayor's Monarch Pledge and, in doing so, committed to taking steps to preserve habitat for the state butterfly of Texas. Staff is currently constructing the Mayor's Monarch Garden outside of City Hall and the Chamber of Commerce Vision XXI Class installed seating areas for visitors to utilize, particularly for the Farmers Market hosted here much of the year.



Water Fountains at Athletic Facilities

The Harker Heights Community Park Baseball & Softball fields and Summit Soccer Complex received new outdoor water fountains that include bottle filling stations for staying hydrated while active.



Dog Park Improvements

The Harker Heights Purser Family Park Dog Park area had several renovations this year; including the entrance to the dog park, new signage, a new bench, and reconstructing/relocating the fence line to avoid common flood areas.

IMPROVING OUR PROGRAMS



GO Heights Program Receives \$30,000 Grant from Texas Parks & Wildlife

The Get Outdoors Heights program received a grant to expand access to the program by providing additional materials such as tents, kayaks, cookware, etc., to participants. It also funded the purchase of materials for the "Girls Outdoors" program, aimed at getting girls active and comfortable in the outdoors.



First Season of Youth Flag Football Since 2012

FY23 marked the first time that the Athletics department hosted a youth flag football program since 2012. Beginning in the late summer, over 100 participants between the ages of 7 and 12 participated in the program, which was held at Summit Soccer Complex.



Peaceable Kingdom Partnership Brings Archery Program "2U" with PK2U

The Parks and Recreation Department and Variety of Texas partnered to bring the Peaceable Kingdom Camp to Harker Heights and to bring Harker Heights to the camp! Archery programs were hosted in various parks throughout the year and Peaceable Kingdom hosted a "Day of Play" at the camp for the entire Harker Heights community.



Ability Sports Program for Children with Special Needs back to Full Strength

While staff began bringing back Ability Sports programming in late 2022, 2023 was when we really got back to full-scale Ability programming. New to the calendar this year was Pickleball, followed by Skateboarding, Bowling, and Soccer.
